Why is January 6 called the Epiphany?

Epiphany is celebrated on January 6 because it's immediately after Twelfth Night, the end of the traditional twelve days of Christmas. In the Catholic Church, the Epiphany of the Lord (January 6th) celebrates the manifestation, or revelation, of Jesus Christ as God's Son to the whole world, symbolized primarily by the visit of the Magi (Wise Men) to adore the newborn King, revealing Him to the Gentiles (non-Jews). This ancient feast, also called Three Kings' Day, signifies Jesus's divinity and mission, with the Magi's gifts (gold, frankincense, myrrh) representing His kingship, divinity, and sacrificial death. The Liturgical Significance: A joyful feast celebrating the fulfillment of prophecy and the beginning of Christ's public revelation as Messiah. In essence, the Epiphany shows that Jesus isn't just for the Jewish people but for everyone, a light shining for all nations to see and worship Him as Lord. (The feast is currently celebrated on Sunday. This year is on January 4)
