

- 5. Concluding Rites: The priest offers final blessings, possibly shares announcements, and dismisses the congregation to "go in peace," emphasizing the mission to live out the Gospel.
- 6. Procession Out: While not a formal liturgical part, the recessional hymn accompanies the clergy and ministers as they process out of the church.
- 7. Silent Reflection: After Mass, many congregants stay briefly in silent prayer, reflecting on the sacred mysteries just celebrated.

Why Catholic: October 12

Now that summer is over & school started, we use this time of year to get back into routines. Take the time to discuss this with your family to reacquaint them with the practices and rituals of our faith. The Seven Parts of the Catholic

Mass

The Catholic Mass is a sacred liturgy rich in tradition and meaning, structured to guide the faithful through worship, reflection, and communion. Here are the seven key parts:

- 1. Introductory Rites: This section includes the Entrance Procession, Greeting, Penitential Act (where the congregation acknowledges their sins), the Kyrie ("Lord, have mercy"), the Gloria, and the Collect (opening prayer).
- 2. Liturgy of the Word: In this part, scripture readings are proclaimed, including the First Reading (from the Old Testament), Responsorial Psalm, Second Reading (from the New Testament), Gospel Acclamation, Gospel Reading, Homily, Profession of Faith (the Creed), and the Prayer of the Faithful.
- 3. Liturgy of the Eucharist: Central to the Mass, this involves the Presentation of the Gifts. Eucharistic Prayer (including the Sanctus (Holy, Holy, Holy), Consecration, and the Mystery of Faith), and the Great Amen.
- 4. Communion Rite: This section prepares the congregation to receive the Body and Blood of Christ, including the Lord's Prayer, Sign of Peace, Lamb of God, Communion, and the Prayer after Communion.
