Why Catholic: June 6

Just what is “Ordinary Time” in the Catholic Church.

Catholic "Ordinary Time" is far from mundane or boring. It represents the structured, numbered weeks of the church year designed to help believers grow in their everyday relationship with Christ.

Why "Ordinary" Isn't Mundane

- * Counted Time: It refers to ordinal numbers (1st Sunday, 2nd Sunday, etc.) used to measure the church's ordered year.
- * The Longest Season: Making up most of the year (about 33-35 weeks), it provides the necessary "breathing room" between major, intense events like Christmas and Easter.

Why It's Actually "Extraordinary"

- * Focus on Christ's Public Ministry: Rather than specific milestones, this season dives deep into the actual day-to-day teachings, miracles, and healings of Jesus.
- * Season of Growth: Marked by green vestments, it symbolizes spiritual growth, maturation, and new life. It is a time for Catholics to learn how to live out their faith in normal, everyday life.
- * Building a Relationship: It shifts the focus from the big, emotional festivals to the steady, consistent practice of discipleship and prayer.
