**Why Catholic:**

Catholic church veil, or mantilla,  
is a traditional head covering  
worn by women during Mass or  
in the presence of the Eucharist  
to signify reverence, humility, and  
the Real Presence of Christ.

Rooted in 1 Corinthians 11, it is a  
personal devotional act that  
symbolizes the beauty of God and  
the feminine role as a life-bearing  
vessel.

**Key Aspects of Catholic Veiling:**

**Significance:** It serves as a visible  
sign of modesty, devotion, and a  
"nuptial" relationship between  
Christ and the Church.

**When to Wear:** Traditionally worn  
during Mass, Adoration, or when  
ever visiting a church with a  
Tabernacle.

**Types & Colors:** Common types  
include infinity veils, circular  
veils, and traditional lace  
mantillas. White/light veils are  
often worn by unmarried or  
younger women, while black is  
traditionally worn by married  
women, though there are no strict  
rules.

No, Catholics are not required to  
wear veils to Mass today. While it  
was a mandate for centuries, the  
Church officially transitioned it to  
a voluntary  
personal de-  
votion dec-  
ades ago.
